Shackles and Sovereignty (vs. 12-14)

¹² I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel, ¹³ so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard and to all the rest that my imprisonment is for Christ. ¹⁴ And most of the brothers, having become confident in the Lord by my imprisonment, are much more bold to speak the word without fear.

(message) ¹⁷ The former claim Christ out of selfish ambition (messenger), not sincerely chinking to afflict me in my imprisonment. ¹⁸ What then? If that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ coclaimed, and in that I rejoice.
